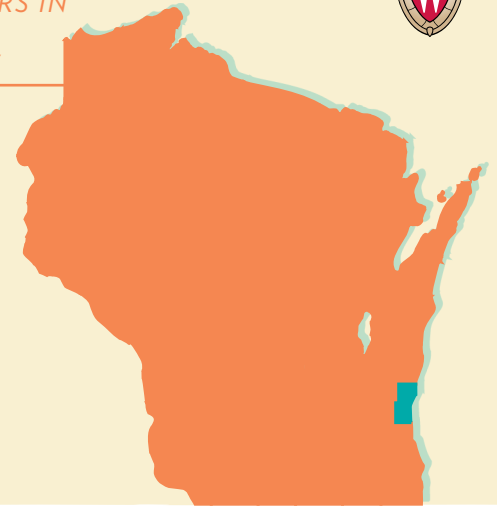




WISCONSIN MASTER GARDENERS IN OZAUKEE COUNTY

Teach gardening to 4-H kids

Ozaukee County Master Gardener Volunteers, in a joint effort with 4-H, established a teaching garden at the county fairgrounds. MGVs designed the garden, installed raised beds, composting area, and fencing. A dozen youth and families participated in growing flowers and vegetables throughout the summer. The *Ozaukee Press* featured the project in their article, "Budding garden masters".

Educate community on invasive animal species

Ozaukee County Master Gardener Volunteers provided community education on the invasive garden pest, jumping worms. Over 80 people attended a presentation by UW Arboretum ecologist Brad Herrick to address the pest, and received **coverage in local media**. Also, during the annual plant sale, MGVs provided visitors with educational pamphlets and educational videos. "The Master Gardeners were the local leaders on this topic in our community," said Stephanie Plaster, Extension agriculture educator.

Educate kids on gardening in outdoor classroom

MGVs used gardening to teach teamwork in an outdoor classroom at Webster Middle School. An activity included students serving snacks made from veggies from the garden to the teachers. One MGV said, "We are glad to have a positive impact on children. Expanding their garden knowledge is one thing; growing their appreciation for the natural world is another. Children share their lessons with their families, extending our educational outreach." Through this project, the Master Gardeners also work with additional area K-12 schools to develop the horticultural capacity of local science teachers and design educational programs.
